October 3rd, 2023 at 5:30 p.m.

Call to Order: Mayor Taskay called the Common Council to order at 5:30 p.m.

Roll Call: Council members present were Mickey Loka, Jeff Kahle, Ed Nystrom, Will Garske, Dale Ernst, Tadd Wegener, Patricia Haskin, and Steven “Ding” Bartz. Absent was Mike Loka.

Also in attendance was Mayor Steven E. Taskay, Deputy Clerk/Treasurer Miranda Swenty, Administrative Assistant Lexie VanStrydonk, Street Leadsperson Nick Rosenmeier, Police Chief Al Elvins (virtual), Library Director Heidi O’Hare, Chamber Director Sherri Hulett, Main Street Director Jennifer Turkiewicz, and Zach Gardner.

Pledge of Allegiance: The Mayor led the Council in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Hearing: MICKEY LOKA MOVED to open the public hearing and GARSKE seconded. The VOTE was unanimous.

2023-05, an ordinance to amend the City of Tomahawk Municipal Code by Amending Chapter 94 Traffic and Vehicles, Article III. Operation of Vehicles Generally, Section 94-115 No Parking Zones, Bus Stops, and Taxi Stops

ROSENMEIER stated that he met with the American Legion and measured the roadway. He stated that it is 34’ 6” wide, four parking stalls would be affected by this ordinance.

ERNST asked how much land (right-of-way) was owned beyond the curb. He also stated that he would think they would want the parking stalls closest to the door. He also asked if it would make sense to limit parking during business hour, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. rather than prohibit the parking.

MICKEY LOKA reminded the Council that we are in the public hearing.

There were no public comments.

2023-07, an ordinance to amend the City of Tomahawk Municipal Code by Amending Chapter 94 Traffic and Vehicles, Article VII. All-Terrain and Utility Terrain Vehicles, Section 94-229 All-Terrain Vehicle Routes (pg. 27)

There were no public comments.

BARTZ MOVED to close the public hearing, and GARSKE seconded. The vote was unanimous.

1 **Public comments:** There were no public comments.

2
3 **Minutes:** GARSKE MOVED to approve the September 5, 2023, September 20, 2023, and September 26,
4 2023 minutes and HASKIN seconded. The VOTE was unanimous.

5
6 **Approval of Checks:** MICKEY LOKA MOVED to approve General Fund account checks 114534 – 114659,
7 9 electronic payments in the amount of \$2,001,053.84, payroll checks 52913 – 52923 and direct deposit
8 checks V126894 – V12773 in amount of \$106,150.99 and Solid Waste Fund check 1924 in the amount of
9 \$154.14. GARSKE seconded. The VOTE was unanimous.

11 **Committee Reports**

12 **Planning and Zoning Commission** – The Planning and Zoning Commission has not met since the last
13 Council meeting.

14
15 **Board of Public Works** – ROSENMEIER gave a report stating the Board of Public Works reviewed an
16 estimate and proposal for water main on McKinley St and reviewed updates on 6th Street Reconstruction
17 and Lincoln Av culvert replacement.

18
19 **Health and Safety Committee** – GARSKE stated that the Health and Safety Committee met last Tuesday
20 and gave a brief report.

21
22 **Finance Committee** – MICKEY LOKA noted that the Finance Committee approved a resolution to apply
23 for an Urban forestry Grant for Emeral Ash Bore (EAB).

24
25 **Park and Recreation Committee** – KAHLE reported that the Committee looked at the parking by the
26 Historical Society and voted to add “No Overnight Parking”.

27
28 **Commission on Aging** – The Commission on Aging has not met since the last Council meeting.

29
30 **Library Board** – O’HARE reported that 4H has brought in their pollinator flower beds. She also stated
31 that she has attended tech webinars regarding artificial intelligence. O’HARE stated that they are
32 getting lots of calls about meeting rooms and they are looking into grants for libraries for transforming
33 communities.

34
35 **Mayor’s Report:** Mayor TASKAY stated he was asked to crown the king and queen for Homecoming. He
36 stated that he has taken numerous phone calls from residents. He also reported he met with two
37 gentleman that have ties to Tomahawk regarding a historical film.

38
39 **Written Report from Tomahawk Main Street, Inc.:** Jennifer Turkowicz, Main Street, Inc. Director,
40 stated that they are wrapping up Fall Ride and that Octoberfest is coming up on Saturday, October 7th.
41 She also noted that they are working on a calendar of events for 2024.

42
43 **Licenses**

44 **Operator Licenses:** GARSKE moved to approve the operator licenses and HASKIN seconded. The VOTE
45 was unanimous.

1 **Ordinances**

2 2023-05, an ordinance to amend the City of Tomahawk Municipal Code by Amending Chapter 94 Traffic
3 and Vehicles, Article III. Operation of Vehicles Generally, Section 94-115 No Parking Zones, Bus Stops,
4 and Taxi Stops

5
6 ERNSTED moved to adopt ordinance 2023-05 and BARTZ seconded.

7
8 HASKIN stated that she does not want to restrict parking for businesses.

9
10 NYSTROM stated that you cannot get heavy equipment through with parking on both sides of the road,
11 he stated that you could go down to S Tomahawk Av but you may end up waiting for traffic and it is
12 inefficient.

13
14 The VOTE was 5-3 with MICKEY LOKA, NYSTROM, KAHLE, ERNST, and WEGENER in favor and HASKIN,
15 GARSKE and BARTZ opposed. Motion passed.

16
17 2023-06, an ordinance to amend the City of Tomahawk Municipal Code Chapter 62 Offenses and
18 Miscellaneous Provisions, Division 2 Curfew

19
20 MICKEY LOKA MOVED to adopt ordinance 2023-06 and ERNST seconded. The VOTE was unanimous.

21
22 2023-07, an ordinance to amend the City of Tomahawk Municipal Code by Amending Chapter 94 Traffic
23 and Vehicles, Article VII. All-Terrain and Utility Terrain Vehicles, Section 94-229 All-Terrain Vehicle
24 Routes

25
26 HASKIN MOVED to adopt the ordinance and ERNST seconded. The VOTE was unanimous.

27
28 An ordinance repealing and replacing Chapter 62 Offenses and Miscellaneous Provision, Article IV.
29 Weapons

30
31 HASKIN MOVED to introduce the proposed ordinance and MICKEY LOKA seconded.

32
33 Chief ELVINS stated that the current ordinance stated that a person cannot carry a weapon in
34 Tomahawk.

35
36 MICKEY LOKA stated that he would like to see a comparison between the current and proposed
37 ordinance before voting.

38
39 The VOTE to introduce the ordinance was 2-6 with HASKIN and ERNST in favor and MICKEY LOKA,
40 NYSTROM, KAHLE, GARSKE, WEGENER and BARTZ opposed.

41
42 ERNST MOVED to send the proposed ordinance back to the Health and Safety Committee for
43 clarification and BARTZ seconded.

44
45 Chief ELVINS stated that the current ordinance is in conflict with constitutional law and when a lady
46 asked for permission to fire a weapon at her property, he noticed the conflict. HASKIN stated that there
47 is not a comparison of the old and new ordinance.

1 The VOTE was 7-1 with HASKIN, NYSTROM, KAHLE, ERNST, GARSKE, WEGENER and BARTZ in favor of
2 sending the ordinance back to Health and Safety Committee and MICKEY LOKA opposed. Motion
3 passes.
4

5 **Other Business:**

6 A proposed lease between the City of Tomahawk and Tomahawk Area Interfaith Volunteers for vacant
7 land in the Tomahawk Senior Community Center Parking Lot (14' X 24') for Erection of a Carport
8

9 MICKEY LOKA MOVED to approve the lease agreement and KAHLE seconded.
10

11 BARTZ asked why the current building could not be used or if a garage door opener could be installed for
12 the current location. KAHLE stated that the garage at the Senior Center is being used by the Parks
13 Department and the Senior Center.
14

15 Discussion followed.
16

17 Karen Johnson, Tomahawk Area Interfaith Volunteers (TAIV), stated that we offered to put in a garage
18 door opener, but it did not seem feasible at the time., all our volunteers are elderly.
19

20 The VOTE was unanimous.
21

22 **Next meeting:** The next regular meeting of the Common Council is scheduled for November 7, 2023 at
23 City Hall, Council Chambers at 5:30 p.m.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CITY OF TOMAHAWK MUNICIPAL CODE BY REPEALING AND REPLACING CHAPTER 62 OFFENSES AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS ARTICLE IV. WEAPONS

The Common Council of the City of Tomahawk, Wisconsin does ordain as follows:

Article IV. Weapons

Section 62-211. ~~Use of Firearms-Definition~~

~~No person except an authorized police officer or person licensed or certified by the state to carry a firearm, shall discharge any firearm or air gun within the city or have any firearm or air gun in his or her possession within the city unless it is unloaded and knocked down or enclosed in a carrying case or other suitable container; provided the council may issue permits to a fully organized gun club to engage in target practice within the city at times and places designated by the chief of police.~~

The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in the section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the subsection, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

- (1) Firearm means a weapon that acts by force of gunpowder.

Section 62-212. ~~Hunting prohibited-Discharging Firearms and other Weapons.~~

~~No person shall hunt fire or discharge any animal within the city with a firearm, rifle, handgun, crossbow or bow and arrow or other weapon in the City limits.~~

- (1) Exceptions. This section shall not apply to the following:

- (a) A law enforcement officer while engaged in official duties.
- (b) The maintenance and use of city-approved supervised rifle or pistol ranges, shooting galleries or firearm, rifle air gun or handgun safety courses.
- (c) The firing or discharging of BB guns upon private premises by person over 16 years or person under such age under the direct personal supervision of a parent or guardian.
- (d) The discharge of a firearm or the other use of weapons as allowed under Wis. Stats. 939.45.
- (e) The discharge of a weapon by a person as authorized by a special resolution passed by the city common council for a specific area, purpose, and limited to a specific duration of time.

Section 62-213. Hunting Regulated.

Hunting is prohibited within the Corporate limits of the City of Tomahawk on lands owned or controlled by the City.

Section 62-214. Throwing or Shooting of Arrows, Stones and Other Missiles Prohibited.

No person shall throw or shoot any object, arrow, stone, snowball or other missile or projectile, by hand or by any other means at any person or at, in or into any building, street, sidewalk, alley, highway, park, playground or other public place within the city, provided the chief of police may issue permits for the use of bows and arrows for target practice if he or she is satisfied public safety is not threatened thereby.

Section 62-215. Exception; Wildlife Overpopulation.

- (1) ~~From time to time~~The common council may designate certain areas of the city as being so overpopulated with certain form of wildlife, such as deer, that it may designate those areas as animal nuisance areas and allow the hunting and destruction of the nuisance animals within that area.

- (2) Prior to the action of subsection (~~1~~ e) of this section, the council shall order the following:

- (a) Give notice and conduct a hearing and make findings upon that hearing as to whether or not there is sufficient evidence to warrant the designation of a nuisance animal area.
- (b) Consult with, and if necessary, obtain any necessary permit or authorization from the state and federal government.
- (c) If any area is designated as a nuisance animal area, the council shall adopt rules governing the destruction of the animals in that area to ensure that it is done safely and in accordance with any permits or regulations of the state or federal government. The council shall also set the limits of the area together with the times that the destruction will be conducted to include the type of weapons and who will be doing the elimination.

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CITY OF TOMAHAWK MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 62 OFFENSES AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS ARTICLE V. SMOKING PROHIBITED IN CERTAIN AREAS

The Common Council of the City of Tomahawk, Wisconsin does ordain as follows:

Article V. Smoking Prohibited in Certain Areas

Section 62-215. Purpose.

The purpose of this Article is:

- (1) To protect the public health and welfare by prohibiting smoking in public places and places of employment; and
- (2) To guarantee the right of nonsmokers to breathe smoke-free air.

Section 62-216. Definitions.

Bar means an establishment that is devoted to the serving of alcoholic beverages for consumption by guests on the premises and which the serving of food is only incidental to the consumption of those beverages, including but not limited to, taverns, nightclubs, cocktail lounges, and cabarets.

Childcare facility means any state licensed or county certified childcare facility including, but not limited to, licensed family day care or licensed group day care centers, licensed day camps, certified school-age programs and Head Start programs.

Educational facility means any building used principally for educational purposes in which a school is located, or a course of instruction or training program is offered that has been approved or licensed by a state agency or board.

Electronic smoking device means any device that may be used to deliver any aerosolized or vaporized substance to the person inhaling from the device, including, but not limited to, an e-cigarette, e-cigar, vape pen, or e-hooka.

Employee means any person who is employed by any employer for direct or indirect monetary wages or profit, including those full time, part-time, temporary, or contracted from a third party; employee also means any person who serves as a volunteer for a business or nonprofit entity.

Employer means any person, partnership, Limited Liability Company, corporation, or other entity, including a public or non-profit entity who employs the services of one or more individual persons.

Enclosed Area means all spaces between a floor and a ceiling that is closed in on all sides by doors, walls, or windows, whether open or closed, the combination of which extends from the floor to the ceiling. A wall includes any physical barrier, whether temporary or permanent.

Health care facility means an office or institution providing care or treatment of diseases, whether physical, mental, or emotional, or other medical, physiological, or psychological conditions, including but not limited to, hospitals, rehabilitation hospitals or other clinics including weight control clinics, nursing

homes, long-term care facilities, homes for the aging or chronically ill, laboratories, and offices of surgeons, chiropractors, physical therapists, physicians, psychiatrists, dentists, and all specialists within these professions. This definition shall include all waiting rooms, hallways, private rooms, semiprivate rooms, and wards within health care facilities.

Person in Charge means the person who ultimately controls, governs, or directs the activities aboard a public conveyance or within or at a place where smoking is regulated under this section, regardless of the person's status as owner or lessee.

Place of employment means any area at which two or more individuals perform any type of a service for consideration of payment under any type of contractual relationship, including but not limited to, any employment relationship with or for a private corporation, partnership, individual or government agency. Place of employment includes any indoor area where two or more individuals gratuitously perform services for which individuals are ordinarily paid. A place of employment includes, but is not limited to, public conveyances, factories, warehouses, offices, retail stores, restaurants, bars, banquet facilities, theaters, food stores, banks, financial institutions, employee cafeterias, lounges, auditoriums, gymnasiums, restrooms, elevators, hallways, museums, libraries, bowling establishments, health care facilities, and rooms or areas containing office equipment used in common. Vehicles used in whole or in part for work purposes are places of employment during hours of operation if more than one person is present. An area in which work is performed in a private residence is a place of employment during hours of operations if:

- (1) The homeowner uses the area exclusively and regularly as a principal place of business and has one or more on-site employees; or
- (2) The homeowner uses the area exclusively and regularly as a place to meet or deal with patients, clients, or customers in the normal course of the homeowner's trade or business.

Private residence means premises owned, rented, or leased for temporary or permanent habitation.

Public place means any enclosed, indoor areas used by the general public, including, but not limited to, restaurants, bars, and other food or liquor establishments; retail stores and other commercial establishments; educational facilities, both public and private; hospitals; nursing homes; auditoriums; sports arenas, including enclosed areas in outdoor arenas; public transportation vehicles, including buses and taxicabs, and ticket boarding and waiting area of public transportation facilities; meeting rooms; elevators; polling places; restrooms, lobbies, reception areas, hallways and other common-use areas; and common areas of apartment buildings and other multiple-unit residential facilities.

Room means a space within a building completely enclosed with walls, partitions, floor and ceiling, except for openings for light, ventilation, ingress and egress.

Smoking means inhaling, ~~or exhaling, burning, or carrying from~~ any lighted or heated cigarette, cigar, pipe or any other lighted or heated similar tobacco, nicotine, or plant product or other lighted plant product intended for inhalation, including hookah and marijuana, whether natural or synthetic. A person having in their possession or control a lighted tobacco product or lighted plant product is also considered smoking. Smoking also includes the use of an electronic smoking device.

Sports arena means sports pavilions, bleachers, stadiums, gymnasiums, health spas, boxing arenas, swimming pools, roller, and indoor ice rinks and bowling centers.

Tobacco bar means a bar that generates 50 percent or more of its total annual gross income from the on-site sale of tobacco products, not including any sales from vending machines.

Retail tobacco store means a retail establishment that derives more than 80 percent of its gross revenue from the sale of cigars, cigarettes, pipes, or other smoking devices for burning tobacco and related smoking accessories and in which the sale of other products is merely incidental. *Retail tobacco store* does not include a tobacco department or section of a larger commercial establishment or any establishment with a 'Class B' fermented malt beverages license or 'Class B' intoxicating liquor license or any restaurant.

Section 62-217. Prohibition of smoking in public places.

Except as otherwise provided, it shall be unlawful for any person to smoke in public places, including but not limited to the following:

- (1) Public forms of transportation, including but not limited to, motor buses, taxicabs, or other passenger vehicles.
- (2) Theaters, libraries, museums, auditoriums, and other convention halls that are used by or open to the public.
- (3) Any childcare facility.
Incorporated herein by reference are the following Wisconsin Statutory and administrative code sections and any amendments or renumber thereof: Secoded. 101.123(1)(ad) and (2)(bm), Wis. Stats; See s. HFS 42.02(4), 46.02(2)(h), and 46.08(2)(c), Wisconsin Administrative Code.
- (4) Retail stores.
- (5) Health care facilities.
- (6) Meeting and conference rooms in which people gather for educational, business, professional, union, governmental, recreational, political, or social purposes.
- (7) Polling places.
- (8) Service lobbies, waiting areas, and the common areas open tot the public of financial institutions, business and professional offices, and multi-unit commercial facilities.
- (9) Self-service laundry facilities.
- (10) Enclosed, indoor areas of restaurants.
- (11) Common areas of malls.
- (12) City buildings.
- (13) City-owned or leased vehicles.
- (14) Sports arenas, including enclosed places in outdoor arenas.
- (15) Enclosed indoor areas of bars.
- (16) Bed and breakfast establishments, hotels and motels, except as provided in Section 62-620.
- (17) Educational facilities, both public and private.

Section 62-218. Prohibition of smoking in places of employment.

- (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke cigarettes or tobacco products in places of employment.
- (2) Every building that is a place of employment shall have at least one entrance that is smoke-free. For buildings with fewer than four entrances, no more than one entrance may be designated as a smoking entrance. For buildings with four or more entrances, no more than 25 percent of all entrances may be designated as a smoking entrance.

Section 62-219. Prohibition of smoking in outdoor areas.

Smoking shall be prohibited in the following outdoor places:

- (1) Within a reasonable distance outside any entrance designated smoke free pursuant to subsection 62-219(2) above, open windows, and intake of ventilation systems of enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited, so as to insure that tobacco smoke does not enter those areas.
- (2) In all outdoor arenas, stadiums, and amphitheaters, except in designated smoking areas, which may be established only in perimeter areas at least 15 feet from any seating areas or concession stands. Smoking shall also be prohibited in, and within 15 feet of, bleachers and grandstands for use by spectators at sporting and other public events.
- (3) In ~~indoor~~ outdoor common areas of nursing homes, except in designated smoking areas, which must be located at least 15 feet outside entrances, operable windows, and ventilation systems of enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited.

Section 62-220. Where smoking is not regulated.

The following areas shall not be subject to the smoking restrictions of this section:

- (1) Private residences, except when used as a childcare, adult day care, or healthcare facility.
- (2) Outdoor areas of places of employment except those covered by the provisions of Section 62-219(2).

Section 62-221. Signage.

- (1) "Smoke-Free Establishment" or "No Smoking" signs or the international "No Smoking" symbol (consisting of a pictorial representation of a burning cigarette enclosed in a red circle with a red bar across it) shall be clearly and conspicuously posted in every public place and place of employment where smoking is prohibited by this ~~ordinance Article~~, by the owner, operator, manager, or other person in control of that place. Signs shall reference "Tomahawk Code of Ordinances, Chapter 62, Article V."
- (2) "Smoking Allowed" signs shall be clearly and conspicuously posted in every public place and place of employment where smoking is not prohibited by this ~~ordinance Article~~, by the owner, operator, manager, or other person in control of that place. Signs shall reference "Tomahawk Code of Ordinances, Chapter 62, Article V".

- (3) Every public place and place of employment where smoking is prohibited by this ~~ordinance~~ Article shall have posted in every entrance a sign not smaller than eleven ~~(11)~~ by eight and one-half ~~(8.5)~~ inches clearly stating that smoking is prohibited. Each sign and the language contained therein shall be clearly visible from a distance of at least ten feet. Every vehicle that constitutes a place of employment under this ordinance shall have at least one conspicuous sign visible from the exterior of the vehicle, clearly stating smoking is prohibited.
- (4) All ashtrays shall be removed from any area where smoking is prohibited by this Article by the owner, operator, manager, or other person having control of the area.
- (5) It shall be unlawful for any person to remove, deface, or destroy any sign required by this section, or to smoke in any place where any such sign is posted.

Section 62-222. Non-Retaliation; Non-Waiver of Rights.

- (1) No person or employer shall discharge, refuse to hire, or in any manner retaliate against an employee, applicant for employment, or customer because that employee, applicant, or customer exercises any rights afforded by this ~~ordinance~~ Article or reports or attempts to prosecute a violation of this ~~ordinance~~ Article. Notwithstanding Section 62-224, violations of this ~~section~~ Article shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$1000 for each violation.
- (2) An employee who works in a setting where an employer allows smoking does not waive or otherwise surrender any legal rights the employee may have against the employer or any other party.

Section 62-223. Enforcement.

- (1) The police chief, building inspector, or an authorized designee shall enforce this ~~ordinance~~ Article.
- (2) Any citizen who desires to register a complaint under this ordinance may initiate enforcement with the chief of police.
- (3) The police department, fire department, building inspector or their designees shall, while an establishment is undergoing otherwise mandated inspections, inspect for compliance with this ~~ordinance~~ Article.
- (4) If an owner, manager, operator, or employee of an establishment subject to this ~~ordinance~~ Article observes a person violating the ~~ordinance~~ Article, he or she shall immediately direct the person in violation to stop smoking. If the person violating the ~~ordinance~~ Article does not stop smoking, the owner, manager, operator, or employee shall make reasonable efforts to prevent smoking in prohibited areas by:
 - (a) Approaching smokers who fail to voluntarily comply with this section and requesting that they extinguish their cigarette or tobacco product and refrain from smoking, or
 - (b) Refuse service to anyone smoking in a prohibited area.

- (5) In addition to the remedies provided by the provisions of this ~~section~~ Article, the chief of police or any person aggrieved provided by the failure of the owner, operator, manager, or other person in control of a public place or a place of employment to comply with the provisions of this ~~ordinance~~ Article may apply for injunction relief to enforce those provisions in any court of competent jurisdiction.

Section 62-224. Violations and penalties.

- (1) A person who smokes in an area where smoking is prohibited by the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of an infraction punishable by:
- (a) A forfeiture not exceeding \$100 for a first violation.
 - (b) A forfeiture not exceeding \$200 for a second violation within one year.
 - (c) A forfeiture not exceeding \$500 for each additional violation within one year.
- (2) Except as otherwise provided in Section 62-222(1), a person who owns, manages, operates, or otherwise controls a public place or place of employment and who fails to comply with the provisions of this ~~ordinance~~ Article shall be guilty of an infraction, punishable by:
- (a) A forfeiture not exceeding \$100 for a first violation.
 - (b) A forfeiture not exceeding \$200 for a second violation within one year.
 - (c) A forfeiture not exceeding \$500 for each additional violation within one year.
- (3) In addition to the forfeitures established by this ~~section~~ Article, violation of this ~~ordinance~~ Article by a person who owns, operates, or otherwise controls a public place or place of employment may result in the suspension or revocation of any permit or license issued to the person for the premises on which the violation occurred.
- (4) Violations of this ~~ordinance~~ Article is hereby declared to be a public nuisance, which may be abated by the city by restraining order, preliminary and permanent injunction or other means provided by law, and the city may take action to recover the costs of the nuisance abatement.
- (5) Each day on which a violation of this ~~ordinance~~ Article occurs shall be considered a separate and distinct violation.

Section 62-225. Clean indoor air.

- (1) *Intent and construction.* The city of Tomahawk finds that it is in the interests of the health, safety, and welfare of the community to adopt by reference Section 101.123, Wisconsin Statute, and subsequent amendments, additions, and recodifications thereto. It is the intent of this ordinance that where there may be conflict between Section 101.123, Wisconsin Statute, or any subsequent amendments, additions, and recodifications thereto, and this ~~ordinance~~ Article, that the provision of the applicable state statute shall apply. This ~~ordinance~~ Article shall not be constructed to mean that progressive discipline of city employees for violations of laws, rules, and regulations is only authorized where explicitly provides by ordinance.
- (2) In the event that Section 101.123, Wisconsin Statute, as effective July 5, 2010 is repealed by an act of the Wisconsin Legislature, this ~~ordinance~~ Article shall be null and void.

(3) *Penalty.* The penalties provided by Section 101.123, Wisconsin Statute, shall be in addition to the penalties provided for violation of this ordinance when a person has violated both laws. In addition to the penalties provided by this ordinance when a person has violated both laws. In addition to the penalties provided by ordinance and Section 101.123, Wisconsin Statute. Any city employee who violates any provision of this ordinance ~~Article~~ or Section 101.123, Wisconsin Statute, may also be subject to progressive discipline by his or her employer.

Section 62-226. Severability.

In the event any ~~ordinance Article, section,~~ subsection, clause, phrase, or portion of this ~~ordinance Article~~ is for any reason held illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this ordinance. It is the legislative intent of the common council that this ordinance would have been adopted if such illegal provision had not been included or any illegal application had not been made.

**Operating Plan
For the Tomahawk Downtown
Business Improvement District 2024**

Wisconsin Act 184 signed into law in 1984 gives Wisconsin municipalities the power to establish business improvement districts (BIDs) within their communities upon petition of at least one property owner within the proposed District. The Legislature created Section 66.1109 of the Wisconsin Statutes (the BID Law) to provide a mechanism by which business properties within an established district could assess themselves to pay for programs aimed at promotion, redeveloping, management, and maintenance of that District. BIDs use a variety of methods to determine assessments, but a majority of Wisconsin BIDs assess real properties based on each parcel's assessed value. Properties used exclusively for residential purposes may not be assessed.

This petition is part of the operating plan that has been developed in accordance with BID statutes. This plan will help govern the BID that will operate from **January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024.**

The hereinafter set forth provisions shall be the "Operating Plan" of the City of Tomahawk Downtown Business Improvement District (hereafter referred to as the "BID").

Purpose for Petition of BID

1. The BID law provides a mechanism whereby private property owners can work together in conjunction with the City of Tomahawk to develop the District. The benefits of the BID will positively affect the value of property located within the BID to ensure the future of downtown Tomahawk. It is not feasible for a small group alone to support the development efforts. A shared cost will allow for long-term results that would otherwise not be available.
2. The exclusive purpose of the BID is to supplement long-term funding for the Tomahawk Main Street Program. The Program will promote Tomahawk's historic downtown, cultural heritage, increase community pride, and diversify its economic base through improvements to the area outlined in Exhibit A. See Exhibit B for the proposed **2024** operating budget of the Tomahawk Main Street Program.

Goals and Objectives

The main goals of the Tomahawk Main Street Program are to revitalize and promote the historic center of Tomahawk. We plan to continue to work with the Wisconsin Main Street program, receiving technical and professional assistance and education in the four-point approach to downtown revitalization.

Tomahawk Main Street, Inc., in partnership with the business community, civic organizations, local government, and residents, fosters the economic and social vitality of Tomahawk by utilizing innovative strategies that cultivate the downtown's unique heritage.

Our downtown's unique and welcoming atmosphere is the backdrop for a diverse mix of businesses, meeting the needs of today's consumer with the personal service of yesteryear. Restored historic buildings and well-maintained storefronts showcase an interesting collection of retail shops, boutiques, eating and drinking establishments, residential units, and professional service providers that are a part of a prosperous downtown economy.

Main Street is the heart of Tomahawk. A volunteer bank of over 150 donates thousands of hours to ensure that our community is restored and preserved for years to come. This program takes on a four-point approach to the revitalization and preservation of our beloved downtown. This approach is built on the development and implementation of four committees. The four committees are as follows:

Promotions: Our Promotions Committee has the important job of promoting downtown Tomahawk as the center of commerce, culture, and community life for residents and visitors alike. They develop both image and retail campaigns to complement business and special events.

Design: Our Design Committee works with local businesses on their individual façade improvement plans. They also work with downtown business owners to create an inviting atmosphere with window displays, lighting, and signage. This committee works closely with the **Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC)** and Wisconsin Main Street Program on façade improvement renderings, design guidelines, streetscapes, and sign ordinance initiatives. **Projects completed to date include updated metal garbage cans on corners not inhabited by fire hydrants or other public works access points; cigarette snuffers for all drinking establishments and restaurants; the Bradley mural restoration; the four-way stop intersection of Somo Avenue and N. 4th Street landscaping update; the landscaping update at the intersection of Tomahawk Avenue and W. Wisconsin Avenue; and signage grants. Continued projects include the petunia and mum flower displays; bench seating; the North for the 4th t-shirt sales, and the Honor Banners.**

Organization: Our Organization committee manages the financial and logistical aspects of our non-profit organization by raising money, recruiting volunteers, and promoting the program. This committee, **in partnership with the Promotions Committees,** facilitates numerous fundraising activities throughout the year. The Main Street Memories Car Show, Spring Fling Wine **and Art Walk,** Fall Ride, and Fall Fest are some of our top promotions. **Additional annual events include our Chili Fundraiser; Annual Meeting; Easter Scavenger Hunt and Fun Day; Farmers Market; Customer Appreciation Sidewalk Celebration; Shop Small Saturday; and Hometown Christmas. New this year, we have also added new events – the Adult Dance; Valentine's Small Plate and Wine Sampling; and Oktoberfest; these were a success, and we intend to include these in our yearly planning and budget.**

Economic Vitality: This committee developed a thorough understanding of the district's economic condition and its best opportunities. They work to strengthen the existing businesses and recruit new ones. It is also the work of the Economic Restructuring Committee to develop financial incentives and capital for building rehabilitations and business development.

Tomahawk Main Street, Inc., has the strong belief that it is imperative to foster a strong relationship with our Elementary, Middle, and High Schools. We work with the High School Art and Technology Departments, **Alternative Education Coordinator,** as well as the FBLA and FCCLA students. The art students come down to Main Street with their teachers to paint the sidewalks for the Spring Fling Wine and Art Walk. The Technology Department builds flower boxes and bench structures to make Main Street a more welcoming location. The FBLA and FCCLA volunteers provide kid activities

during our Easter Scavenger Hunt and Fall Fest events and offer assistance as requested and needed for other events as well.

In addition, volunteers from the Senior Center have stuffed car show bags, and some have been helpers during Trick or Treat, fostering multigenerational cooperation.

Even with the continued pandemic, Our fundraising efforts were revitalized this year continue to generate income for our downtown district. We were able to raise over \$25,000.00 for our organization to continue to have the variety of events we host each year. The City of Tomahawk, in their generosity, granted us \$7,500.00; we greatly appreciate their generosity, and understand this donation is not guaranteed each year. We continue to apply for additional funding. We will continue to search for funding sources such as additional grants, county and corporate contributions, and private gifts/endowments in order to leverage approved BID area projects such as Tomahawk Main Street Bricks and Mortar Grant program, streetscape projects, and other beautification efforts targeted at the downtown. In addition, we will continue to build the following initiatives into our annual work plans:

- Continue to advertise our downtown area with various campaigns that promote both our retail events and our large draw events like the Spring Fling, Main Street Memories Car Show, Fall Ride, and Fall Fest.
- Work with the Chamber of Commerce, the Lions Club, the Historical Society, and other area organizations to coordinate and implement both existing and new downtown events and festivals.
- Work with area retailers in promotion of the BID area.
- Recruit stores and develop other BID attractions.
- Strengthen existing businesses and management practices through the Wisconsin Main Street education offerings, Lincoln County Economic Development Corp., UW Extension, and Nicolet College.
- Recruit future business owners and leaders. Utilize Youth Apprentice interns and incubate new entrepreneurs via working with and encouraging our area's young people.

BID Administration

By BID statute, a Board of Directors has been appointed to implement and monitor the operating plan. The Tomahawk Downtown BID Board of Directors currently consists of six five voting members and one non-voting Common Council representative. A majority of Board members must own or occupy real property in the BID area. Board members shall be appointed by the Mayor within 60 days of creation of the BID and shall serve two-year terms. It is intended that the Board of the BID shall have all powers authorized by law, and this operating plan shall be reviewed and refined on an annual basis and submitted to the Common Council for action.

The BID Board shall review and present to the City each year, as required by the BID Statute, an annual report describing the current status of the BID, including expenditures and revenues, an independent certified audit of the implementation of the operating plan, an accounting of funds previously expended, recommendations for any seats on the BID Board becoming vacant, and a proposed budget and plan for the following year containing such amendments as they feel are proper. There will be two BID meetings per year, one to present the upcoming year's operating plan, and the other to discuss year-end results.

Proposed BID Assessment

1. Funds will be raised through a special assessment levied against real property located within the BID. Such assessments will be levied as an exercise of the municipality's power under the provisions of Section 66.1109, Wisconsin Statutes. The proposed BID assessment will be \$3.00 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation. Any proposed future increase in the BID assessment is subject to majority approval by the BID Board.
2. In no event shall property used exclusively for residential purposes be subject to assessment.
3. In the spirit of public-private cooperation, the City of Tomahawk, through which the BID is formed, will incorporate BID assessments into the property tax assessments at no charge to the BID organization. Upon payment of BID assessments, the City of Tomahawk, on or before March 31, will pay to the Tomahawk Main Street Program all BID assessments actually received by that date. The balance of BID assessments will be paid in September, after tax settlement with Lincoln County for second half taxes.

General

The BID Assessment is hereby levied by the City, which shall be a lien against each of the tax parcels or real property contained in the BID, unless exempted as identified herein, under Section 66.1109 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

All exhibits referenced are incorporated herein by reference. As required by the BID Statute, the City received a petition from a group of downtown Tomahawk real property owners organized as the Downtown Business Council. Modifications to this BID Plan required by the Planning and Zoning Commission or Common Council shall be incorporated into the final plan adopted by the City as its final ordinance, regardless of earlier proposals.

The BID is within the City and is composed of contiguous parcels subject to general real estate taxes. Parcels of property located within the boundaries of the BID are shown and described in Exhibit A, but not subject to general real estate taxes on January 1 of the previous year for which the BID Plan is adopted by the Tomahawk Common Council are hereby excluded for the BID by definition and are not assessed.

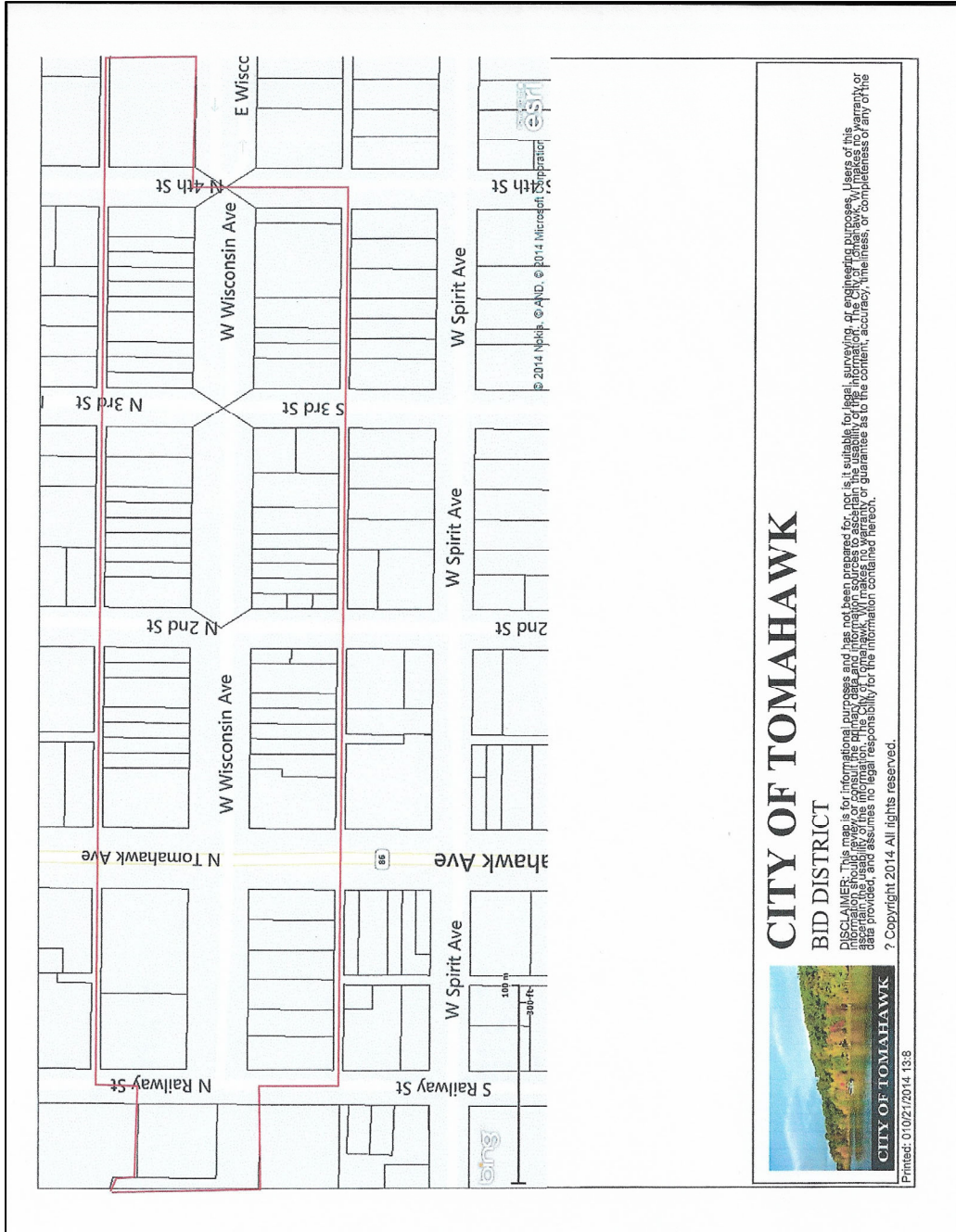
Exhibit A---BID Map
